Re: Re-Accreditation of the Vocational Bachelor in Theology Programme

Dear Jeff

In the meetings of October 25-27, 2011 the EEAA Council discussed the report submitted by the VET with regard to the accreditation visit of May 2011. The EEAA council commends GBI for the work done in the development of the programme according to the 2006 EEAA Manual.

I am pleased to announce the following decision by the EEAA Council:

GBI is granted re-accreditation of its Vocational Bachelor in Theology Programme with some recommendations to work on and to be reported in the Annual Progress Reports (see Follow-up form).

The accreditation of the aforementioned programme is issued for 5 years. GBI is required to submit Annual Progress Reports in order to maintain the accreditation. The school must undergo a thorough Review Visit after 5 years (Spring 2016).

I also attach to this letter the Follow-up Form which traces the developments after the visit. Please be aware of the fact that schools are expected to work continually in the areas in which the Evaluation Team has spelled out recommendations, and to report on the progress in these areas in the Annual Progress Report.

The EEAA wishes GBI continuing progress as the school serves the church in mission through theological education.
